The City of Mount Vernon was settled in 1805 by three Revolutionary War veterans. Wanting to honor the general and president they served, they named the community after George Washington's famous home. Mount Vernon has become a thriving community, named an "All American City" in 1965 by *Look Magazine* and "Ohio's Most Liveable Community" in 1994 by *Ohio Magazine*. The city of 14,500

residents maintains full-time staffs for fire, police and medical emergencies, and the community is served by more than 50 churches, a community hospital, a public school system, three private schools and more than 100 service clubs and organizations. The beautiful Kokosing Gap Trail Bike Path begins just next to Mount Vernon Nazarene University, and continues for 14 miles ending in Danville, Ohio.

R. R. Hodges Chapel & Fine Arts Center
This beautiful facility, dedicated in 1990, has seating for nearly 1,900. Stunning stained-glass windows uplift the spirit for prayer, meditation and worship.



Thorne Library/Learning Resource Center
This 3-story, 44,000-square-foot facility offers over 117,000 volumes in various formats, as well as several study rooms and computer laboratories.



The Eternal Flame
The Eternal Flame serves as a reminder of the University's founding, as well as Christ's light forever shining before us.



Lakeholm Administration Building
Awarded an Ohio Historical Society marker, the house originally belonged to Columbus Delano, Ulysses S. Grant's Secretary of the Interior.



William & Evelyn Prince Student Union
This building is attached to the Donoho Recreation Center, and offers an activity/game room, snack bar, state-of-the-art fitness center, computer kiosks, lounge areas and more.



Hyson Campus Center
This building includes the dining commons, post office, computer laboratories and several offices for various student services.



Founders Hall
Founders is a starting point for new students. Admissions, Financial Aid, Student Accounts and the Welcome Center are located on the first floor. Several academic departments and the WNZR radio station are upstairs.
